Freedom Records announces the **April 22, 2008**, release of ***Too Much Desire***, the new album from **Texan Songstress Robyn Ludwick**. This is Robyn's first album on Freedom, and it follows her critically acclaimed and raved-about 2005 debut *For So Long* which placed among many local and national Top 10 lists for 2005, including the *Austin Chronicle* and KUT, as well as at the No. 1 spot on the EuroAmericana Chart, just to name a few.

Robyn delivers a set of soulful originals full of passion and breadth in the aptly titled *Too Much Desire*, showcasing Robison family members as well as Grammy nominee and Austin Sweetheart Eliza Gilkyson on several tracks.

As the title suggests, with *Too Much Desire* is how Robyn writes and how she sings, and you will believe her, experientially, as she lets you into her heart – or at least into a specific moment of her story. Recorded at brother Bruce Robison's Premium Sound Recordings in Austin, Texas, the album features a familiar cast of characters that includes husband and producer John Ludwick, co-producer Mike Hardwick and her Austin All-Star band – Mike Hardwick (electric and acoustic guitars, dobro), Eddie Cantu (drums, percussion), John Ludwick (bass, percussion, vocals), Andrew Nafziger (lap steel, electric guitar, banjo, dobro) and Michael Ramos (piano, B3). Also making musical/vocal cameos are Karen Poston, Warren Hood, Eleanor Whitmore, Kim Deschamps, Rich Brotherton, Stefano Intelisano and Matt Slusher.

From the seductive, Fleetwood Mac-esque first track *Alright* to the folk/pop edge of *Big Fall* and *Boulevard*, to the Texas crowd favorite *Monte Carlo* and on the rocker *Desire*, the album resonates with bad-girl imagery, and *Too Much Desire* is the common thread.
